The Mary Neville Award recognizes outstanding achievement in prevention and early intervention in children's mental health services. Lorna, who recently retired as Director of Children's Services and Best Start at the Region of Peel, facilitated PCC's partnership with the Region to provide children's mental health resourcing for childcare centres, Best Start sites and Ontario Early Years Centres. She was also instrumental in

PCC held an "Extreme Reno Hard Hat Tour" on November 9th to thank the funders who have enabled us to renovate a residence to house our Residential Treatment Program for latency-aged (7-11) children. Located on Queen Street in Brampton, the new facility will be larger than our current residence for this age group, enabling PCC to serve more children in a therapeutic and safe environment.

We were delighted that Hon. Laurel Broten, Minister of Children and Youth Services, was able to celebrate with us. Ontario's Ministry of Children and Youth Services has provided a capital grant of \$450,000 towards the renovations. We are also grateful for leadership gifts of \$25,000 from the TD Bank and \$10,000 from CIBC, which will help PCC furnish the residence. Jonathan Saunders, Residential Counsellor, shared the story of a child who was treated in PCC's current Tullamore residence for latency-aged children. This boy, who had serious mental health difficulties following years of abuse, is now thriving and has won awards at school.

## DONOR RECOGNITION EVENT

PCC invited major donors, sponsors and partners to an evening reception on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Credit Valley Golf Club to thank them for their generous support. Roman Boychuk, President, and Humphrey Mitchell, Executive Director, explained how PCC counts on donations to meet the Peel community's need for mental health services for children, youth and their families.

To illustrate the impact of donations, Susan Elbe, Clinical Supervisor, shared the story of a PCC client being raised by his grandparents following his mother's struggles with mental illness. After being suspended from school because of serious behavioural issues, this youth came to PCC and has been highly successful in residential treatment. He is attending school again and earning marks in the 90s. Everyone was moved by a touching letter in which this youth shared his hopes and dreams for a bright future as a computer scientist.

The occasion also afforded CIBC the opportunity to present a **\$25,000 leadership gift** in support of PCC's Intensive Child and Family Services for children/youth ages 7 to 17.

## RESEARCH GRANTS ADVANCE EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE AND REDUCE STIGMA

PCC is a partner in several clinical research projects, thanks to our staff's success in building partnerships and securing research grants. Two of our recent projects are featured here.

Staff have secured a program evaluation research grant from the **Provincial Centre of Excellence for Child and Youth Mental Health** to continue implementing and evaluating **Coping Power**, an evidence-based treatment that works with parents and latency-aged (7-11) children



who display aggressive behaviours. This intervention has been successful in our Connect Program and is now being implemented in two PCC Day Treatment classrooms.

We are also pleased to partner with Maria Liegghio, a doctoral student in social work at **Wilfrid Laurier University**, on *Working with Youth with Mental Health Issues as Collaborators In Research about Self and Family Stigma*. Many thanks to the **Mental Health Commission of Canada** for funding this project. PCC is grateful for this opportunity to contribute to the mental health field's understanding of how to **reduce stigma** associated with a mental health diagnosis.
